These sessions are **biblical**, **practical**, **and eye-opening**, helping us connect giving to our spiritual formation as disciples of Jesus.

St Mary's Financial Situation

We want to be transparent about our finances because a good understanding of our church's financial health is part of belonging to St Mary's. Our **PCC (church trustees)** oversee finances, ensuring we manage resources wisely. We also apply for grants and look for cost-saving measures where possible.

However, our current level of income is not sustainable in the medium and long term. Running St Mary's costs **£31,000 per month (£1,000 per day)**, covering:

- ✓ Diocese payments
- ★ Staff salaries
- ✓ Outreach & ministry costs
- ✓ Utilities, insurance, maintenance & cleaning
- Missions support, evangelism & more

Unlike some may think, we don't receive money from the Church of England—in fact, we give to support other churches in our Diocese!

For 2025, we are facing a £41,000 deficit. To help close this gap and strengthen our reserves, we are holding Gift Days on 23 & 30 March, aiming to raise £60,000. This will allow us to:

- Cover the budget shortfall
- ★ Build up our ever-decreasing reserves
- Fund future projects (such as installing LED lighting)

If you are able, we encourage **regular giving** through **Standing Order** and **Gift Aid**. For the Gift Days we also encourage giving whatever lump sum you prayerfully feel it right to give. However, if you're facing financial hardship, **please feel no pressure to give**—our heart is for generosity and empathy.
